The meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order at 7:00 pm by Director Miller

After inviting public comment, there were no public comments made on Non-Agendized Topics.

After inviting public comment, no public comments were made.

Director Cain motioned to approve the consent agenda and approve Items C1, C2, C3, C4, and C5 as submitted, 2nd by Director Holthaus. Motion passed 3-0.

IV. REGULAR AGENDA BUSINESS ITEMS

R1. Approval of the WOODSIDE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT'S PRELIMINARY BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025

After inviting public comment, no public comments were made.

Director Holthaus inquired about the workers' compensation program, its history, the reasons for the increase in claims, and potential strategies to reduce injuries.

Chief Cuschieri informed the Board that around 2015, there was a significant increase in workers' compensation costs. Initially, they were covered by State Fund Workers Compensation Insurance. Chief Dan Ghiorso advocated for a change, leading to a switch to SDRMA, which contracted with Intercare, following Sedgwick. Various companies have merged over time. SDRMA currently helps achieve better rates, and through Target Solutions, they provide training to prevent injuries. Despite efforts, injuries still occur due to the nature of fire service work. The wellness committee and other programs aim to reduce injuries. SDRMA offers a self-insured workers' comp program and will

eliminate their third-party administrator from July 1st, potentially lowering costs. Research is being conducted to find better rates, but no changes can be made until April 2025 due to current policy constraints. Currently, there are 12 open workers' comp cases.

Director Miller commented that the budget increased by \$3 million, which isn't ideal but expected. Last year, there were no funds for a repayment station, but this year, nearly a million of the increase is due to new debt on the fire station. He checked, and the revenue also increased similarly, so the budget appears balanced for now. However, predicting future budgets is challenging as revenue typically rises with the tax base, though occasionally state financial issues have affected it. It's important to note higher spending now includes \$1 million in extra debt service for recent construction, and they are about to purchase the neighboring house, impacting cash flow. Tracy's accounting assumes the cash is spent, and the numbers seem correct. Estimating next year's expenses is difficult due to the new station and its unknown operational and maintenance costs.

After further discussion, Director Holthaus motioned to approve item R1. The WOODSIDE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT'S PRELIMINARY BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 as submitted, 2nd by Director Cain. Motion passed 3-0.

Director Holthaus motioned to approve item R2. Adopt Resolution 24-05 A RESOLUTION OF THE WOODSIDE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT CALLING FOR AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 5, 2024 FOR THE ELECTION OF TWO MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS as submitted, 2nd by Director Cain. Motion passed 3-0.

R3. Consider taking the following actions: (1) Adopt Resolution 24-06 A RESOLUTION OF THE WOODSIDE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT RATIFYING THE FIRE MARSHAL'S SIGNATURE ON A CONTRACT WITH SAN MATEO COUNTY FOR ENHANCED FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES IN THE COMMUNITIES OF LOS TRANCOS WOODS AND VISTA VERDE NEIGHBORHOODS AND FINDING THE CONTRACT IS EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT and (2) find that the Contract is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") under the following categorical exemptions: CEQA Guidelines section 15307 (actions by regulatory agencies for protection of natural resources), and CEQA Guidelines section 15308 (actions by regulatory agencies for protection of the environment).

After inviting public comment, no public comments were made.

Chief Cuschieri explained that years ago, the Los Trancos and Vista Verde Water Districts transitioned to Cal Water but retained funding of about \$300,000 annually. This money is used for enhancing the district, focusing on fuel management, home hardening, and vegetation management. The funds are managed through the county, and they are now formalizing this arrangement.

General Counsel Rubin Cruse: (Transcribed as recorded)

"I just wanted to echo the chief's comments. That is correct. It's basically a pot of money, primarily a pot of money to provide incentives for private homeowners to do fuel mitigations on the property. There are also some additional provisions in there for the district to do some fuel mitigation

management along some particular roads that benefit these particular areas. And so, it's been around for a while, and this is a new contract, and it's mostly cleaned up to continue this program that has existed, as I understand it, for several years. We wanted to make sure that we complied with the public contract code, having the district make the findings that it's in the public interest to enter into this contract and, of course, make the appropriate CEQA findings as well. I'm happy to answer any additional questions.”

Director Holthaus motioned to approve item R3. Consider taking the following actions: (1) Adopt Resolution 24-06 A RESOLUTION OF THE WOODSIDE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT RATIFYING THE FIRE MARSHAL'S SIGNATURE ON A CONTRACT WITH SAN MATEO COUNTY FOR ENHANCED FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES IN THE COMMUNITIES OF LOS TRANCOS WOODS AND VISTA VERDE NEIGHBORHOODS AND FINDING THE CONTRACT IS EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT and (2) find that the Contract is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) under the following categorical exemptions: CEQA Guidelines section 15307 (actions by regulatory agencies for protection of natural resources), and CEQA Guidelines section 15308 (actions by regulatory agencies for protection of the environment), as submitted, 2nd by Director Cain. VI. FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

District Updates

- July 1st we held our employee and family open house at Station 7. Approximately 160 people were in attendance. It was a great event. Once again I would like to thank Mrs. Elianne Popell for her generous donation in hosting the event. Also, a special thank you to all of our department members that helped in making this special get-together happen.
- On June 3rd Woodside units helped assist at an 8-Alarm structure fire that occurred at 2700 Middlefield Road, which is in the Menlo Park Fire District. The fire started in a large 6-story wood frame building that was under construction. Utilizing our mutual aid system, Woodside Fire sent Battalion 2, Engines 7, 8, 19, and Water Tender 108 to assist in this defensive fire operation. In total, 26 fire engines, 7 truck companies, and 10 additional engines were requested from Santa Clara County. Because of this, the County reached its maximum drawdown of resources. Coverage for our District was initiated through the Dispatch Center where we had units covering our District from the central and north parts of the County. Also being that this was going to be an extended event, we took the initiative to hire back personnel to up-staff a Battalion Chief and reserve fire engine which remained in effect for about 7 hours. All crews and equipment returned home safely from the event. An after-action review is being completed for review of the incident.

Station Updates

- Station 7- Earlier this month we conducted our final punch list walk through and have resolved all the remaining items. We are waiting for our final inspection with the Town and to receive our final invoices from Vance Brown.
- T-Mobile will be submitting updated plans to the Town for relocation of ground mounted infrastructure. The project team indicates about 6 months until the monopole is up and running. At which time the COW will be removed.

Recognition

- I would like to mention that Selena Brown was honored at the San Mateo County First Responders Public Safety Night last week. She was nominated by Woodside Fire for all the work she has contributed to the District over the last 22 years. Congratulations to Selena.

San Mateo County Updates

- Dissolution of Fire Net 6. As of September 1st, 2024, the Fire Net 6 Radio JPA which includes Woodside Fire, Menlo Park, Redwood City/San Carlos, San Mateo County and Coastside Fire, will be dissolved. This will allocate all our joint south zone radio infrastructure into the ALS JPA. This in turn will create a more streamlined ability to maintain and control the county's radio system.

State Updates

- Fire season is here for the state- as of today there are 2,429 wildfires that have burned throughout the state resulting in 95,562 acres burned and 50 structures either destroyed or damaged.
- On the early morning of June 17th, we, and San Mateo County, were called to provide an OES Mutual Strike Team for deployment to the "Point Fire" in Sonoma County. Our Woodside Battalion Chief Keenan Hird deployed to the event to assist as a Strike Team Leader where he spent a few days with the team. They were then redirected to a new incident called the "Sites Fire" in Colusa County. Chief Hird returned home after being out for 6 days.
- As of June 18th, the US Senate passed the Fire Grants and Safety Act Bill (S.870). This bill will prevent the termination of the Assistance to Firefighters Grant known as the AFG program. Now passed, this bill will authorize \$750 million for AFG and SAFER Grants for 2024-2028. Our goal will be to submit for any grants we can qualify for.

3117 Property Purchase Agreement Update

- Today I was sent the Certificate of Acceptance and Grant Deed forms to review. These have now been signed and with a closing taking place by the end of the week.

VII. REPORT ON WRITTEN COMMUNICATIONS

Director Pat Cain informed the Board that he will resign as a Director of the Woodside Fire Protection District, effective at the end of this meeting.

Director Cain gave a brief history of his many decades of service and introduced John Foster to the Board.

Director Miller, Director Holthaus, and Chief Cuschieri expressed their gratitude for Director Cain's service.

The purposes of this Conflict of Interest Code are to provide for the disclosure of investments, real property, income, and business positions of designated Woodside Fire Protection District (hereinafter referred to as “WFPD”) officials and employees that may be materially affected by their official actions and to provide for the disqualification of designated officials and employees from participation in WFPD’s decisions in which they may have a financial interest.

Background

The Political Reform Act of 1974 (Government Code Sections 81000 et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. This regulation and any amendments thereto may be incorporated by reference by local agencies and, together with the designation of employees and disclosure categories, meets the requirements of the Political Reform Act.

Adoption of Conflict of Interest Code

The terms of Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 18730 are hereby incorporated by reference and, along with the attached Appendix in which officials and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Woodside Fire Protection District.

Pursuant to the Political Reform Act and its regulations, all designated employees shall file statements of economic interests with the WFPD, which shall retain a copy and forward the originals to the San Mateo County Clerk, who shall be the filing officer. The San Mateo County Board of Supervisors shall be the code reviewing body.

Subsequent amendments to Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 18730 duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, after public notice and hearings, are also incorporated by reference unless WFPD, within 90 days after the date on which an amendment to Section 18730 becomes effective, adopts a resolution providing that the amendment is not to be incorporated into this Code.

A designated official or employee assigned to Category 1 is required to disclose direct or indirect investments in any business entity that may foreseeably be affected materially by any decision made or participated in by the designated official or employee by virtue of his or her position.

Category 2. A designated official or employee assigned to Category 2 is required to disclose interests in any real property that may foreseeably be affected materially by any decision made or participated in by the designated official or employee by virtue of his or her position.

Category 3. A designated official or employee assigned to Category 3 is required to disclose any source of income that may foreseeably be affected materially by any decision made or participated in by the designated official or employee by virtue of his or her position.

Category 4. A designated official or employee assigned to Category 4 is required to disclose any business entity in which the designated official or employee is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or holds any position of management that may foreseeably be affected materially by any decision made or participated in by the designated official or employee by virtue of his or her position.

It is the mission of the Woodside Fire Training Division to provide on-going training, education and funding to our fire service personnel to ensure competent, efficient and effective emergency response.

The Training Division helps support a multitude of different areas within our organization to help accomplish our many goals. These areas include our District Training, Probationary Training, Recruit Academy support, South Zone/County Training, Continuing Education Program, PPE Program and USAR Program. The Training Division Chief, while on shift, also attends the SMCO Training Officers Committee.

The Woodside Fire Training Cadre was developed to enhance the delivery and unify department training. The Cadre is a highly knowledgeable, skilled and certified group of firefighters dedicated to delivering modern training concepts, skills and evolutions.

Below are the topics the Training Division has covered for the month of June.

WOODSIDE FIRE TRAINING

A. Didactic Training: The Lead Instructors for the month of June were Fire Captain Jonathan Francisco and Firefighter Brandon Cuschieri. The didactic training consisted of reviewing multiple videos on vertical ventilation strategies and tactics as well as ladder specifications and the reviews of Woodside Fire SOG 401 - Engine Company Vertical Ventilation.

B. Manipulative Training: June manipulative training was designed by Captain Francisco which included a lecture on flow path, horizontal ventilation and vertical ventilation. The manipulative drill took place at Shinnyo-En in Redwood City. Crews are given a scenario in which

vertical ventilation could not occur. This can often be the case in multi-story dwellings. Crews used their knowledge, skills and abilities to clear the floor of smoke in order to complete other essential fire ground duties.

SOUTH ZONE MULTI-DEPARTMENT TRAINING

A. The South Zone training topic for the month of June was Forcible Entry. Crews for all South Zone agencies met at the Redwood City Corporation Yard. At the yard, there are multiple training props where crews apply their tactics in gaining entry through residential doors, commercial doors, bars on windows and garage doors.

PROBATIONARY TRAINING

2023 Probationary Firefighters (Lory and Martin)

The 2023 Probationary Firefighters have completed their first block of probation and are now assigned to station 19. Their Block II training curriculum encompasses apparatus inventory, vehicle stabilization/extrication, rope rescue and wildland fire operations

MONTHLY EMS REPORT

June 2024

This report encapsulates the significant activities and advancements made within our Emergency Medical Services (EMS) division during the month of July.

Overview

July has been a month of significant progress and accomplishments for our EMS division. As we continue to prioritize excellence in patient care and operational efficiency, we have achieved several milestones worth highlighting.

- **PSTrax Controlled Substance Management Platform**

Our implementation of the PSTrax online platform has been incredibly successful. This web-based platform has proven to be a significant upgrade in our medication management and accountability. All members have completed training and demonstrated competency in the program, which has become a streamlined fixture in our daily routine. As the JPA South representative, the process of managing controlled substances for our neighboring agencies has also been greatly aided by PSTrax. We now have a modernized process of inventorying, transferring, and managing narcotics between WFPD, Redwood City, and Menlo Park, which gives us significantly better accountability measures.

- **Addition of new equipment**

The EMS division has taken delivery of new highly advanced training tools from iSimulate. REALTi360 is a modular simulation ecosystem that incorporates a patient simulator and device simulator, allowing our members to practice patient care in the most realistic of settings. The iSimulate digital simulated screen will replicate the Lifepak15 monitors carried on our apparatus, so our paramedics will get to train as close to real as possible.



The Atlas manikin is a life-sized, highly advanced training tool that will greatly improve our members' abilities to practice patient care. Not only does it allow for hands-on training of infrequent skills such as intubation and intraosseous needle placement, but it also communicates to the REALTi 360 monitor to deliver instant feedback based on provider's interventions, creating fully immersive scenarios.

- **Vehicle Extrication Training**

This month, Woodside Firefighters conducted hands-on training that simulated a multi-vehicle accident that required stabilization and extrication of a trapped victim. As part of this training, paramedics needed to manage patient care from start to finish of their scenario. Once successfully extricated from the vehicle, patient care continued with a simulated pleural decompression. With this training, we emphasized high quality patient care throughout the duration of a highly technical, lengthy rescue. All members performed extremely well throughout the week, and continued to demonstrate the high levels of proficiency and pride that have become synonymous with Woodside's patient care.



Certification Achievement—Firefighter Josh Robbins has received California state certification as a paramedic. He is currently in the process of performing his San Mateo County “5-call,” which will allow him to become accredited by the county and serve as a working paramedic for Woodside Fire. Josh has been proctored by Firefighter Paramedic Nick Passanisi. This significant accomplishment reflects Josh’s dedication and hard work and will further strengthen our paramedic team.

Conclusion

July has been a productive month for the EMS division, marked by significant advancements in training, equipment, and operations. These developments collectively enhance our service delivery, ensuring we remain at the forefront of pre-hospital emergency care.

I am proud of the dedication and hard work demonstrated by our EMS personnel in completing the training and adapting to new equipment and systems. We will continue to monitor the impact of these changes and strive for continuous improvement in all aspects of our operations.

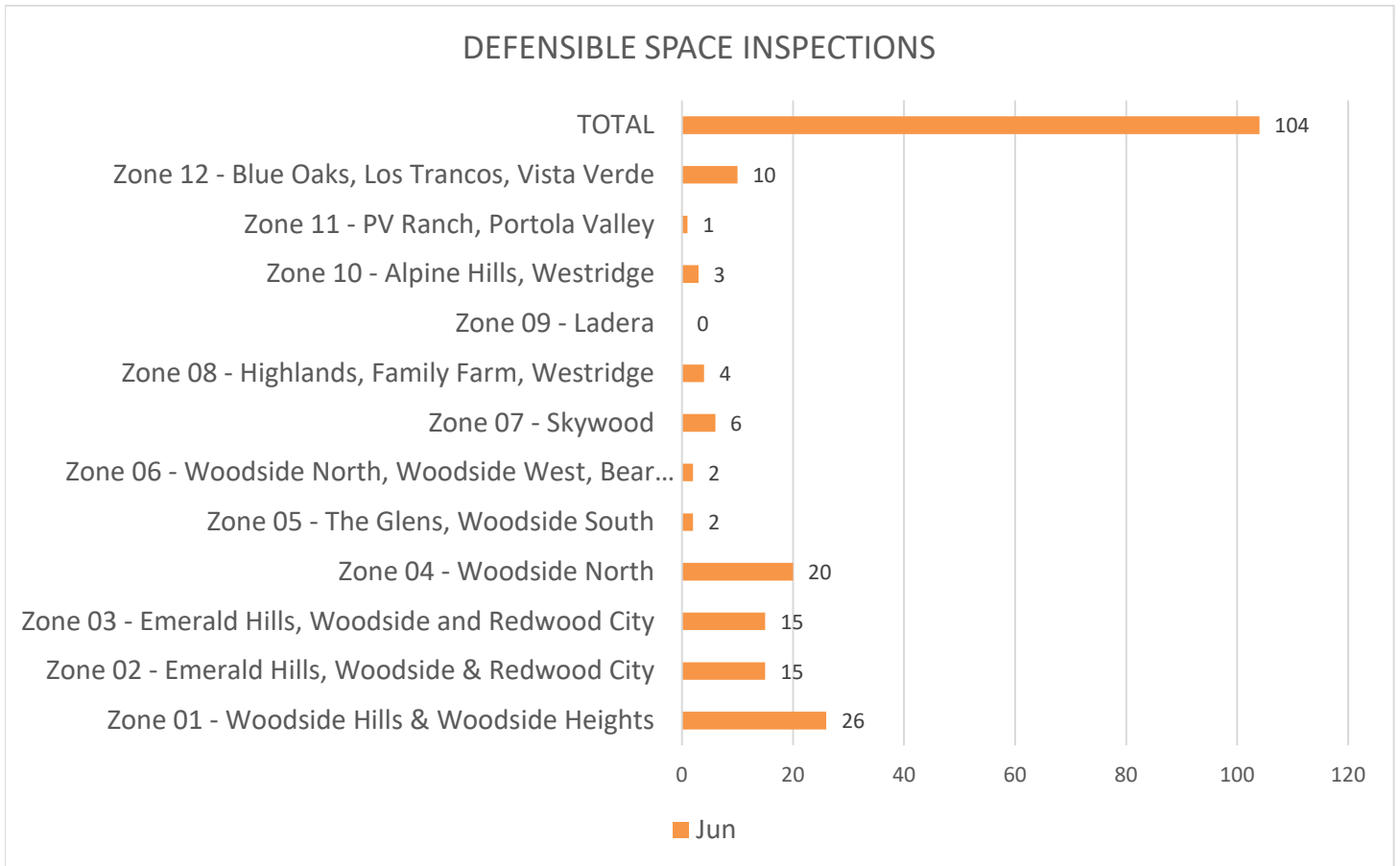

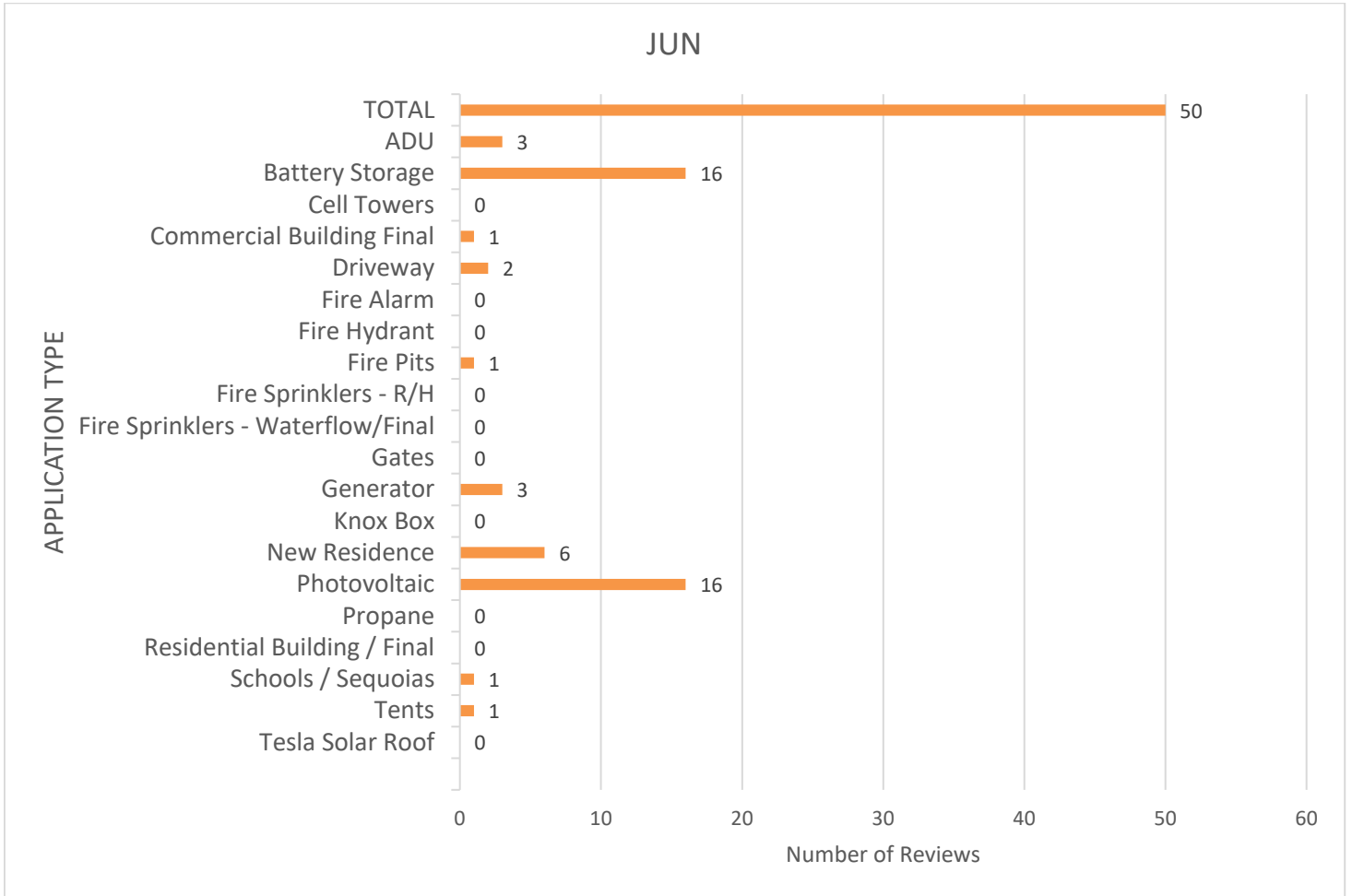

DEFENSIBLE SPACE

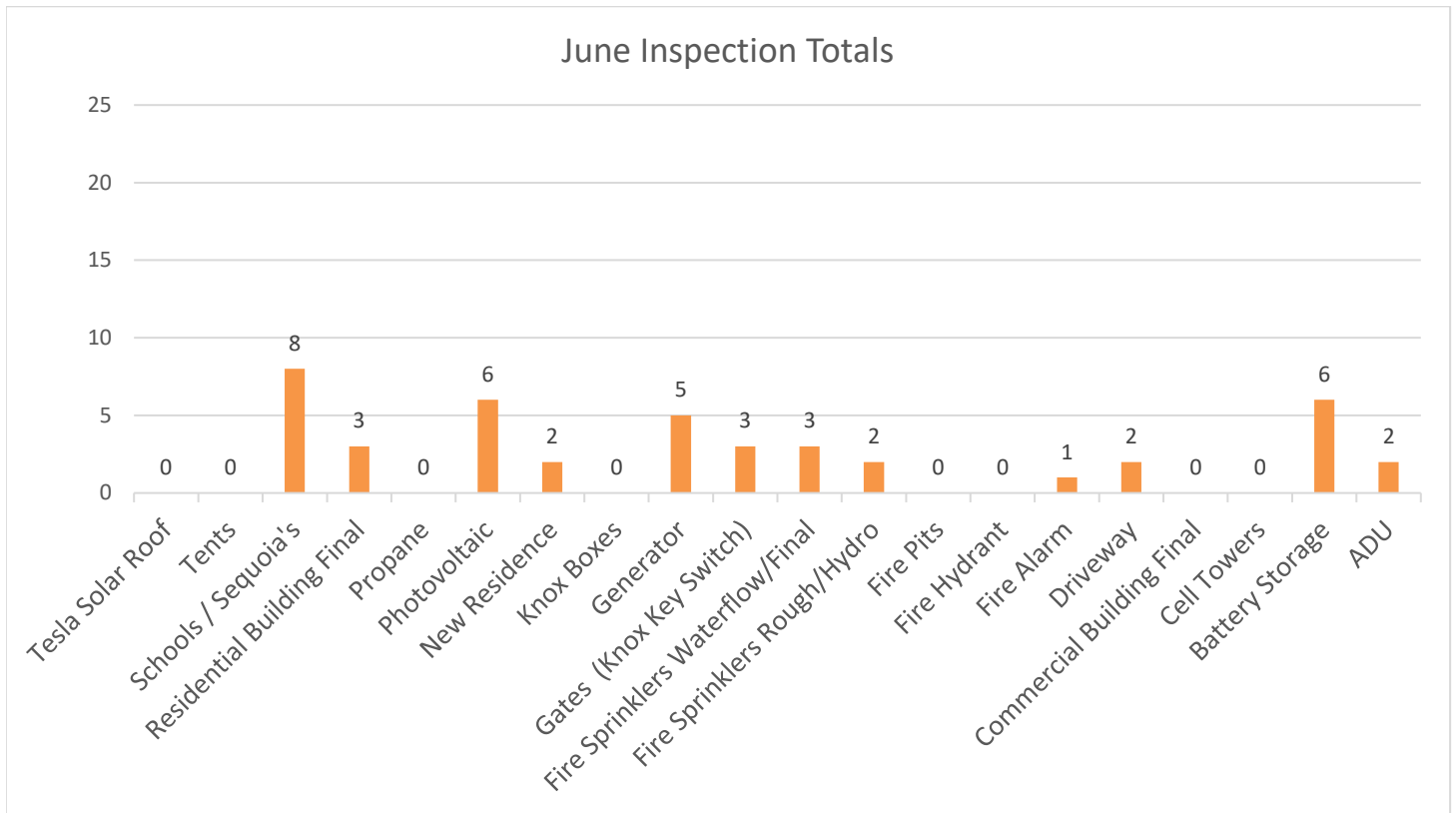

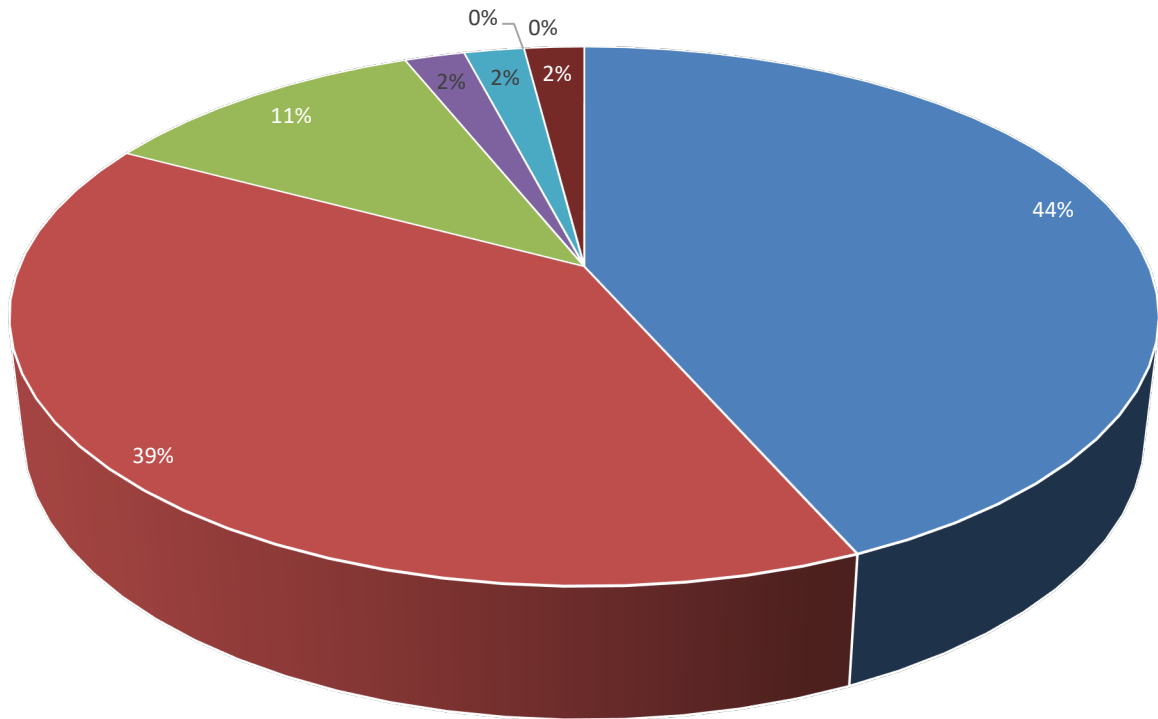

Fuel Mitigation Division

Summary

I. This Month the Fire Mitigation crew chipped:

- Ladera (70 piles and 65 cubic yards chipped)
- Westridge (112 piles and 127 cubic yards chipped)
- Woodside Glens (10 piles and 7.7 cubic yards chipped)
- Highlands (53 piles and 46.7 cubic yards chipped)

The crew had a bye week on chipping because they were dedicating time to other projects listed below.

II. The crew has been working along Bear Gulch Drive for the Portola Valley (right-of-way) ROW work. There were simultaneous efforts while working in this area with another contractor. While WFPD crews were working on the ROW, which was adjacent to a heavily overgrown vacant lot, the contractor was cleaning up the lot, which resulted in the creation of one fluid break from the street up into the private lot.

III. The crew completed all the annual weed and grass abatement in the LTCMD properties. (Los Trancos / Vista Verde)

IV. The crew also mitigated the overgrown grasses in the newly purchased Lot next to station 7 making it safer from Wildfire.

V. WFPD Crew and San Mateo County Fire Safe Union worked together in the County ROW along the north side of Sandhill Road between Sandhill Court and Manzanita Way. A contractor removed 12 large hazardous Eucalyptus trees endangering powerlines. WFPD Mitigation crews conducted a Shaded Fuel break simultaneously on the native trees along the same stretch of roadway.

- A contractor also removed 10 large Eucalyptus trees on the Family Farm property overhanging powerlines adjacent to Portola road. This was also a joint project between WFPD Crews and SMC Fire Safe.

- Fuel mitigation work on Sandhill and Family Farms

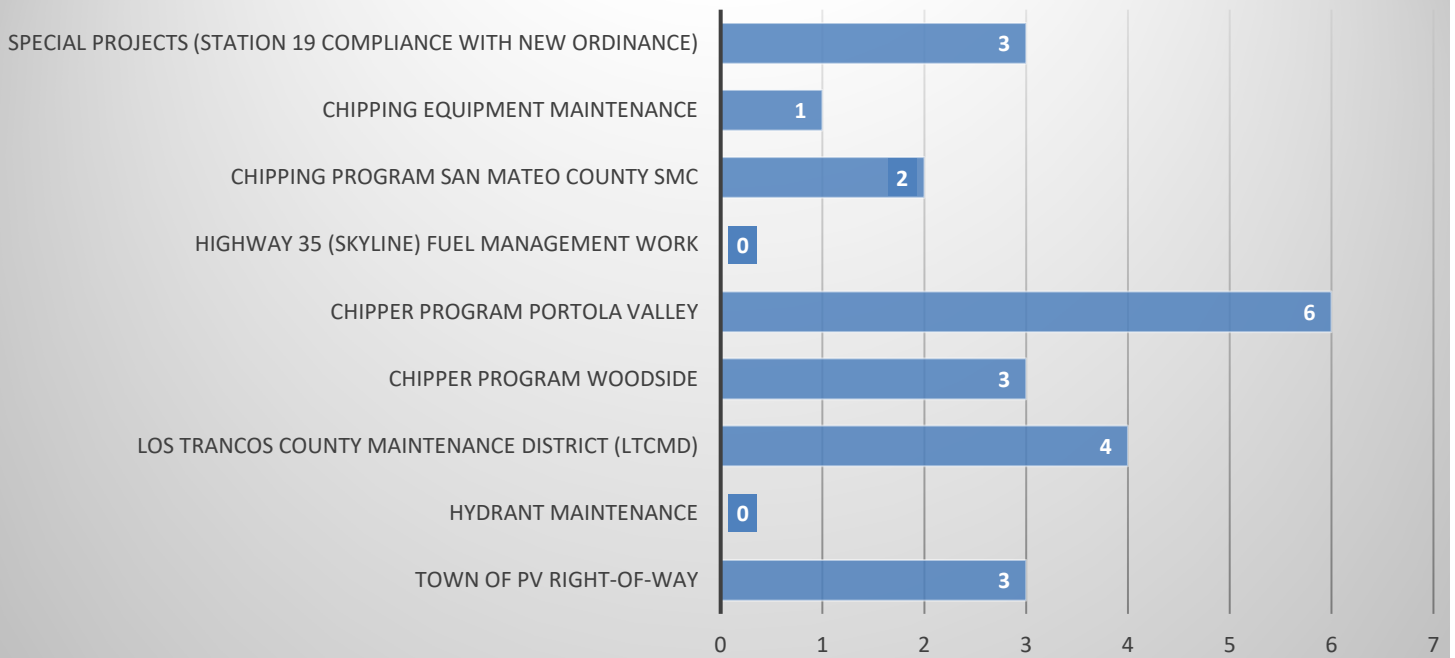

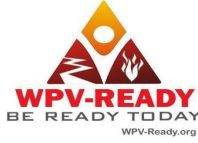

Emergency Communications and Safety Day

On June 22nd, Emergency Communications and Safety Day took place at Woodside Fire Station 8 alongside ARRL Field Day. ARRL Field Day is the premier on-the-air event in the US and Canada, held annually on the fourth weekend of June, drawing over 35,000 amateur radio operators who join their clubs, groups, or friends to broadcast from remote locations. Hosting the event at Station 8 significantly increased foot traffic. WPV-CERT Updates

WPV-CERT has purchased a Firefighter Rehab trailer funded by the Woodside-Portola Valley Fire Protection Foundation. The trailer still needs to be outfitted to be fully deployable. In the meantime, we are working to establish a Mutual Aid Agreement at the county level, ensuring optimal response times and resource utilization. Notably, the Menlo Park Firefighter Rehab Team was dispatched to the recent 8-alarm fire and proved to be a valuable resource for the first responders.

The Woodside Fire Operations Division roles and responsibilities are to provide an efficient safe operating strategy that adheres to County and District Policies and Guidelines. We also maintain our fleet and all associated tools and equipment to maintain a constant state of readiness. To respond not only in our fire district but throughout the County and State. The Operations Div. is also responsible for the Health and Wellness program, Safety Committee and loss reduction. Which contributes to the organization's success.

The Operations Division helps support a multitude of different areas within our organization to help accomplish our many goals. These areas include Prevention and Fuel Mitigation support, manages our Single Resource program and equipment, Recruit Academy support, The Operations Division Chief, while on shift, also sits on committees such as SMCO Operations Committee, Safety and Loss Reduction committee and Apparatus committee.

Below is the status of the fleet and equipment status and an update of ongoing projects for the month.

B. Vehicles:

1. Eng. 8 OOS for a repair on the main computer. Seagrave has completed an upgrade and that's what is believed to have caused the issue, B&E is working with Seagrave to rectify the issue. Still waiting on parts from Seagrave
2. Rescue 7 back in-service repairs have been completed.
3. E507 Went in for 1,000. Mile check after we replaced the motor.

The Woodside Fire Logistics Division exists to provide oversight and organization to the maintenance and welfare of all Woodside Fire Protection District facilities, as well as the technology platforms necessary for our daily operations. We strive to provide the most current and relevant technologies and equipment to all our facilities and apparatus ensuring that our employees have everything they need to serve our community at the highest standard. We maintain our stations in a manner that would make the citizens we serve proud, and we ensure the safety of all who work in and visit our stations daily. We research and apply for grants with both federal and local governments to leverage available public funds to help augment the budgets needed for our mission and the collective mission of the WFPD. The Logistics Division continually looks for new methods to keep our facilities and our technological and operational capabilities current with industry best practices of the modern fire service as well as plans and anticipates for the operational growth and technological advancements of the future.

Facilities

Station 7:

- The Station 7 project continues with small jobs needed to complete the project for final inspection and with the final details of the closeout process underway.
- The leaf guards were installed on all exterior gutters. The lights were adjusted by Watt Stopper in the station and apparatus bays to satisfy neighbor complaints of too much light pollution at night. Watt Stopper agreed to provide training for the use of the lighting control system by WFPD employees.
- The closeout process including instruction manuals for the various mechanical systems of the building is underway and the vendors should be providing these in the weeks after final inspection.
- The irrigation system managed by Bob Cleaver design will allow the station firefighters to manage the irrigation via an iPhone app called Hydrowise. Bob will be meeting with BC2A to implement the system at both stations 7 and 8.
- The final inspection has been scheduled for July 2nd so with any luck we will be through final inspection for the 4th of July holiday.
- The new HVAC systems at both stations 7 and 8 will require a much more complicated and robust maintenance program so we are in contact with bay area vendors to provide a competitive annual contract for service.
- Lastly on June 1st Woodside Fire hosted the “Ringing in Station 7” celebration where we welcomed family, friends and retirees for the first time to the new station. We had a very large turnout; the event was a

resounding success and marked a real milestone in the history of our department. It was fun to see the looks of pride and wonder on the faces of our retirees who were seeing the new station for the first time. The event was sponsored by a very generous and kind local resident who provided a pizza-making truck made from an antique fire engine and 2 jumpy houses for the kids one of which was so large it barely fit in the parking lot of the station! The resident also created a rubber ducky scavenger hunt throughout the station which delighted the kids as they scoured the firehouse for the little rubber ducks of all shapes, themes, colors and sizes. The children of Woodside Fire will forever refer to the party as “the jumpy house party.”

Station 19

- The Station 19 landscaping project continues with work from a landscaping contractor to begin next month. A painting contractor has been selected from 3 bids and the painting project will be scheduled for some time late in the summer. The fire alarm control panel (FACP) at station 19 has been malfunctioning and after thorough evaluation it was found to need replacement. After exploring various options and costs it was decided to invest in the FACP replacement to ensure the proper operation of the alarm system and safety of its residents! The project is planned to commence in early July in the new fiscal year.

Station 8

- Plans continue to finish the remaining three old bedrooms at station 8. They will be modernized to match the two new bedrooms getting a significant facelift including new lockers, paint and carpet.

IT Update:

- In addition to its daily work to keep us operating and secure Stepford has completed the installation of our RingCentral phone system and the First Arriving software as well as VMDT was added to our BC office monitor.
- The folks at Green Team are working with us to continue our mapping and preplan projects.
- The Microsoft 365 training program syllabus and schedule have been finalized and the instruction will be offered to the entire department in the fall over a two-week period in August and September.

Grant Opportunities

The FEMA Assistance to Firefighters grant program is close to announcing its grant awards for this last cycle, so we will see if WFPD is among those awarded.
